

RECORD OF PROCEEDINGS

TOWN OF KREMMLING
REGULAR TOWN BOARD MEETING
June 17, 2020

The Board of Trustees, for the Town of Kremmling, met in the boardroom located at 200 Eagle Avenue. This meeting was broadcasted via Zoom due to COVID-19 and closed to the public. Mayor Grover Pryor called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. Trustees present: Jim Miller, Holly Martinson, Jason Wikberg, Dave Sammons, and Erik Woog. Staff present: Interim Police Chief Annette Dopplick, Town Manager Dan Stoltman, Public Works Director Jason Bock and Town Clerk Joanna Eaton. Absent: Trustee Leo Pesch.

Trustee Martinson wanted to amend the regular Town Board meeting minutes from May 20, 2020. Trustee Martinson does not recall saying she was in agreement with the discussion and action on the Police Chief job description and ad.

SAMMONS MOVED TO APPROVE THE REGULAR TOWN BOARD MEETING MINUTES OF MAY 20, 2020 WITH THE CHANGES REQUESTED BY TRUSTEE MARTINSON. WOOG SECONDED. ALL "AYE" VOTES.

WOOG MOVED TO APPROVE THE EXPENDITURES DATED MAY 21 THROUGH JUNE 17, 2020. IN THE AMOUNT OF \$142,208.76. SAMMONS SECONDED. ALL "AYE" VOTES.

SAMMONS MOVED TO APPROVE THE AGENDA AS PRESENTED. WOOG SECONDED. ALL "AYE" VOTES.

Constantine Tsaconopoulos spoke during the public comments. He brought to the board his concern of the new construction going on by his house. This construction is for the new Dollar General, he is concerned with the amount of dirt and dust that is blowing around the neighborhood from this job site. Manager Stoltman said this is something the contractors have been mitigating and will continue doing so but will contact them to ensure it continues.

No further discussion was made. No further comments from the citizens.

Public Works Report – Jason Bock reported:

lack of people visiting the museum they have not had any revenue coming in during the COVID-19. Therefore, they can't afford to hire someone to mow the yard at the Kremmling site. This is something that Larry used to do himself, but no longer is able to. Mr. Gross asked Manager Stoltman if the Town could possibly mow the property. Manager Stoltman told the Board that currently there is not a set policy in place that allows the use of town equipment and personnel to assist nonprofit organizations. His recommendation to the Board is to donate funds from the Town to the historical society. Manager Stoltman stated that he is comfortable donating anything between \$500- \$1,000 and believes this is something that could be refunded from the COVID reimbursement program.

SAMMONS MOTIONED TO DONATE UP TO \$1,000 TO THE GRAND HISTORICAL SOCIETY. WIKBERG SECONDED. ALL "AYE" VOTES.

Discussion and Action on the Town's participation with the Kremmling Days Parade -

Dawna Heller as petitioner – Dawna Heller from the Kremmling Chamber was present and began speaking on how most of the actives for Kremmling Days have been canceled due to the COVID-19 besides the parade. The Chamber Board decided on two events during Kremmling Days that they strongly believe could fall under the State's and the County's current regulations. These two events are the parade and the cliff golfing. The Chamber plans to organize the parade as a "March". The parameters will be changed and no candy or floats will be allowed. Social distancing guidelines will be in place as well. The Chamber is asking for the support of the Town to help with the traffic control. Mrs. Heller does not expect this to be a problem and believes that the community is up to date and will follow the guidelines in place. Manager Stoltman has been in contact with CDOT and the Police Chief, he believes that the March is ready to go and that the Chamber has planned to the best of their ability. Interim Police Chief Dopplick has been in contact with State Patrol in regard to this topic, her two concerns are no floats allowed and to keep the tempo of the parade going. Dawna Heller wanted to thank the Board for listening and for any support they will be able to give to allow this event to move forward for the Chamber.



She is strongly asking the Board to have it marked and believes it can be affordable. Trustee Sammons has a couple of concerns; he stated that the children or anyone in harm will not recognize that vehicle as a police vehicle while it remains unmarked. Chief Dopplick agrees and


Discussion and Action on Cares Act Fund Dollars – Manager Stoltman started by stating that Grand County has been awarded 1.3 million in Cares Act Relief funds related to COVID-19 expenses that are to be distributed among the county government and municipalities. In order to receive these funds, the Town's must come up with an agreement. Donations, telecommuting costs, cleaning supplies, attorney fees, and any other expenditures related to COVID-19 could all be reimbursed to the Town.

WOOG MOTIONED TO APPROVE THE COLLABORATION AGREEMENT INCLUDING EXHIBIT A AND B AS PRESENTED. SAMMONS SECONDED. ALL "AYE" VOTES.
