

RECORD OF PROCEEDINGS

KREMMLING SANITATION DISTRICT

REGULAR BOARD MEETING
JANUARY 11, 2021

The Board of Directors for the Kremmling Sanitation District met in the boardroom located at 200 Eagle Avenue. The Town Hall is currently closed to the public due to COVID-19 precautions and restrictions. The meeting was available on Zoom.us for public participation.

The meeting was called to order by President Jason Bock at 6:00 p.m. Directors present: Jason Bock, Dwayne Uhrich, Dave Sammons, and Ken Bentler. Director(s) absent: Eric Bradley. Staff present: Superintendent Jeremy Bock and District Manager Rich Rosene. Audience present: None.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES: SAMMONS MOVED TO APPROVE THE REGULAR MEETING MINUTES OF DECEMBER 14, 2020 AS PRESENTED. UHRICH SECONDED. MOTION CARRIED.

APPROVAL OF EXPENDITURES: SAMMONS MOVED TO APPROVE THE EXPENDITURES PRESENTED FOR THE PERIOD OF DECEMBER 15, 2020 THROUGH JANUARY 11, 2021 IN THE AMOUNT OF \$73,722.30. BENTLER SECONDED. MOTION CARRIED.

PUBLIC COMMENT: None.

ENGINEER'S REPORT: None.

OPERATOR'S REPORT: Superintendent Bock reported that about \$103,000 was collected for the septage receiving station revenue in 2020. He has taken in about 7,500 gallons so far in 2021.

A connector on a small blower melted and he has contacted Brandon at Water Technology Group to get it fixed. He told Brandon it should be a warranty repair. It is on the 480V wiring and he isn't going to attempt to work on it. WTG is now an employee owned company as Cogent Company, the umbrella company, was bought out by employees. He is working on getting prices for a compressor and hopes to have one by March.

The ammonia is high this month on a test he just did early this month. It went from 0.75 mg/L to 21 mg/L, which is about double the amount we are allowed. He will test again later in the month to see if it comes back down. He talked to Wade at Wastewater Compliance Systems about it and reminded him that they are still under a process guarantee. Pond B is still at about 7 mg/L, but something is happening in Ponds C and D that causes it to go back up. This has been a problem each January for a couple of years and Bock doesn't think it is from some sort of slug of effluent. He said he still plans to add a 6" connector line so he can have one blower per pond for Ponds B and C. This is something he thinks WCS should pay for as the domes are not performing the way they should. The water temperature is at 1.2 degrees C which is very similar to the past two years. He will be testing for BOD tomorrow and hopes this may tell him something.

Sammons asked where Bock was on getting his new certification. Bock said there still aren't any in-person classes but he hopes that may change this spring as COVID restrictions lighten up. Bock is current on his training hours for recertification, but needs the classes to get ready for the B exam. He is working with Scott Weber to get started on his small systems wastewater exam. It is difficult to do the initial training online as Weber isn't familiar with any of the information and math needed to take the exam.

BUSINESS ITEMS: Rosene said that we set the location annually for the posting of the monthly agendas for the board meetings at the town hall. An annual notice is also posted at the Post Office with the time and location of the meetings and the standard agenda.

BENTLER MOVED TO APPROVE RESOLUTION 2021-1-1, A RESOLUTION TO DESIGNATE AGENDA NOTICE POSTING LOCATION. UHRICH SECONDED. MOTION CARRIED.
